

PRESSURE ON EDUCATIONISTS TO BE ROLE MODELS UNDER INCREASING WESTERNIZATION

To commemorate the birth anniversary of Bharat Ratna Awardee Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, who served the nation as first education minister of independent India for more than ten years from 1947 to 1958, a function was held by Maharaja Ranjit Singh Punjab Technical University Bathinda. Speaking on the occasion to a capacity full venue, Prof B D Sharma (Retd) spoke on the evolution of relationship between the student and teacher along with its impact on the society. "A teacher today not only needs to become a role model but a torch bearer to bring the young students out of the darker zone, which is surrounded by the West, said Sharma. He also answered various queries raised by the students and faculty during interactive session.

Azad was instrumental in establishing Sangeet Natak Academy, Lalit Kala Academy, Sahitya Academy and Indian Council for Cultural Relations ICCR, so that the spirit of competition and quality enhancement stays on the scene. Azad also advocated universal Primary education and girl education along with free and compulsory education for all children upto the age of 14 besides Vocational Training and Technical Education.

Professor Gursharan Singh, the Campus Director of Giani Zail Singh Campus College and Dean Academics of MRSPTU presided over the function. He told that students need to be put through such motivational lectures often and appreciated the interest exhibited by the students particularly during the interactive session.
